#### K-2 NEWS

It's been a great start to Term 2. Last week we looked briefly at ANZAC Day and read some Anzac stories. We talked about the meaning of Anzac Day



and the importance of acknowledging the day each year and participating in the Guyra Anzac Day March.

L3 Activities and L3 groups are in full swing and I attended my 4<sup>th</sup> training day on the 28<sup>th</sup> of April. Two days a week we focus on Guided Writing and the other two days Guided Reading. Working in groups of three has been great and really allows time to focus on student's individual needs. We have just started Interactive Writing (which the students love). In

Interactive writing the teacher models what 'good' sentence writing looks like. Over the last two weeks, we have focused on using



capital letters to begin sentences and how to use finger spaces between words.
